

## The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) prohibits educational agencies or institutions and their employees from disclosing personally identifiable information from a student's educational record without the student's written consent. 20 U.S.C. § 1232(g). Specifically, FERPA requires that a student provide a written and signed statement that (1) specifies the records that may be disclosed; (2) states the purpose of the disclosure; and (3) identifies the party or class of parties to whom the disclosure may be made. 34 C.F.R. § 99.30.
